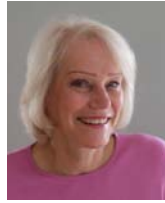

Q: Who typically takes lactation consultant training?

A: Registered nurses, Licensed practical Nurses, Pediatric
Nurse Practitioners, Women's Health Nurse

Practitioners, Midwives, Obstetricians, , Pediatricians,
Family Practice MDs, La Leche League Leaders, WIC
workers, Breastfeeding Peer Counselors, women who
have breastfeed their infants, and women who have a
degree in an unrelated field. Anyone with a

commitment to breastfeeding mothers and infants! So
you can see that people who come into the field of
lactation come from a wide variety of backgrounds.

Q: How long does it take to complete the Lactation
Consultant Training Program?

A: It depends on how much time you have to devote to
study. Most people complete it in 2-3 months. You have
access to the courses for a year, so you can go back and
review close to the time of the certification exam.

Q: Once I complete the training, how do I get the clinical
experience that the IBLCE requires?

A: If you are working in a setting where you advise,
counsel or teach breastfeeding mothers, document your
hours in a log. If you do not have access to
breastfeeding mothers, consider an internship program.
We offer internships in the metro Washington DC area,
or contact a lactation consultant in your area. See the
